## **Rules and Regulations**

- 1 All flower growers, other than commercial producers and florists are eligiible to bring exhibits
- 2 Persons exhibiting flowers in horticulture must have grown the flowers and have plant in possession at least three months prior to the exhibition.
- 3 Exhibitors may have one entry per class or subdivision of class, and may enter as many classes as desired.
- 4 Exhibitors must have entries in clean containers with water prior to submitting them. Containers must be stable enough to support the cut flower. Please DO NOT use plastic or foam cups or plastic bottles.
- 5 Specimen means one flower or stem, or in foliage or berry plants it means one stem or branch. Collections are at least three specimens in one container, which may be the same types and colors or may be mixed. Plants that naturally grow with foliage should be displayed accordingly, All plant specimens should be well-groomed Remove excess foliage below water line before placing in container.

- 6 All C Entries will receive ribbons only. All A and B entries will receive money and ribbons
- 7 Prior to acceptance, all entries must be idetified by exhibitor and labeled with flower's common name.
