Rules and Regulations

This section is open to all Pope County Green Thumbs, except commercial producers and florists

- 2 Persons exhibiting plants must have grown them and must have had them in their possession for at least three months prior to exhibition
- 3 Exhibitors may have one entry per class or subdivision of class, and may enter as many classes as desired
- 4 Specimen means a single plant. Collections means a group of at least three (3) plant specimens in one container. These may be the same kind or mixed.
- 5 All entries must be clean, attractive, insect free, disease free, well groomed and in acceptable containers. Containers must be pots of a size and weight that can be handled easily. With the exception of trees and shrubs, no container can be more than twelve (12) inches in diameter and fifteen (15) inches high, Exhibitors with oversize containers, trees and shrubs, will be required to move them to designated areas. All containers must have water trays to prevent damage to areas and insure safety.
- 6 Trailing or vining plants and other plants entered as Hanging Baskets must be light enough in weight for display on overhead pole or rod.
- 7 All flowering plants must be in bloom at time of entry and flowers cannot be removed and entered as cut flowers.

Plants that have been entered in previous exhibitions or previous fairs must not be exhibited again.

- 9 Prior to acceptance, all entries must be identified by plant's common name
- 10 No Air Ferns will be accepted.
- 11 Committee not responsible for damages or broken containers
